### 6<sup>th</sup> agenda item: Open Discussion

- Pests:
  - o Use cinnamon, tanglefoot, diatomaceous earth, or cornstarch to keep ants away from hives
    - Ants will eat the eggs
  - Use wasp traps early in the spring to kill the queens, use fake wasp hives to trick wasps into thinking territory is taken
    - A wasp can kill a weak hive
  - o Para-Moth, wrap, and put lights on hives to keep wax moths away
- If you lost hives due to natural events, you could recoup costs from the Farm Service Agency
  - Must document the loss
- The CSU-Extension office can ID larva you bring in at no cost
